

The following was written by Elder J.C. I ran across it as I was trying to see how church buildings in that area had fared during Hurricane Michael. This was the last article published before the Hurricane hit that area and the website has not been updated since. My friends at St. Andrew, we as a church in mid Missouri are praying that God was merciful with you and your church. May God bless all of His people in the world in whatever moment of storm you find yourself! I thank Elder Stanaland for the thoughts expressed in his article.

Psalm 92:1 "It is a good thing to give thanks *unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High*". The Psalmist was obviously lifted up with joy as he was meditating upon the great and marvelous works of "*the LORD*"! There are times when the blessedness of "*the LORD*" our God settles upon us much like the early morning dew upon the green grass. It nourishes us, strengthens us, moves us to reflect His glory, and comforts us. In just such a moment, when the Psalmist was rejoicing in awe of the majesty of God, he declared unto God, "*It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High!*"! He determined to "*shew forth*" the Lord's "*lovingkindness in the morning, and*" His "*faithfulness every night*" (Psalm 92:2); that is, when I wake "*in the morning*", I will praise Him because He is so loving and kind to me; when I lay down at night, I will praise Him for being so faithful; that is, everything "*the LORD*" promised, He has done, and He has never forsaken me. The Psalmist gloried, not in his own works, but in the works of the Lord (Psalm 92:4). He praised the Lord for protecting him from the wicked (Psalm 92:7). He praised the Lord for making him strong (Psalm 92:10). He praised the Lord because He prospered His beloved Children (Psalm 92:12). He punctuates his moments of praise by declaring, "*the LORD*" "*is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him*" (Psalm 92:15)! "*It is a good thing to*", morning and night, "*give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto*" the Holy "*name*" of our "*most High*" God.

May God bless a **good thing** to come out of your time of trial and know that we others are praying for you and the congregation of St. Andrew.
