

STAY THE COURSE

This week we laid to rest a beloved and wonderful man of our church and community. Jimmy Lloyd Sapp was a man that touched and positively affected more lives in this community than he ever knew. As we gathered for his graveside funeral service Saturday afternoon I was amazed at the crowd of people, both young and old, that walked through the fields covered with snow to pay their respects and say farewell to this beloved man. I have never attended a graveside service with so many people in attendance. It was a true testament to the life and memory he left behind. Though our hearts are grieved and somewhat shocked by his death, Saturday afternoon showed a true picture of everything good about a small town. It was a testimony to all of us that the greatest sermon you ever preach is the one you live.

I thought a lot this week of the words that Jimmy Lloyd shared at the close of each sermon he attended. He would always say, “stay the course preacher, stay the course.” As I learned this week, I was not the only minister he shared these words with. Staying the course of truth and faith was the path I believe Jimmy Lloyd was always referring to. A course that leads across the desert land of the trials and pains of this life and brings us to the mountain tops of God’s joy and grace on us. I am a believer that life is as much about the journey we take as it is about the destination. The story of Moses comes to mind. In Deuteronomy 34, when Moses came to the end of his journey and his life the Lord lead him high to the top of mount Nebo. There Moses looked over the promise-land that his journey had brought them to. He had traveled through the valleys and deserts of this world and before the Lord called him home God allowed him to see the purpose of that journey. Truly, Moses stayed the course, through many times of trial and hardship still his faith held true, that the journey we walk has a purpose and a promise at the end of it. God has set before each of us the path of life which leads through the pains and hardships of this life and guides us to the mountain tops of his grace and blessings that wait for us. Heaven is the destination that we know lies before each of us, but life is a course we travel to get there. May our journey be a faithful testimony of God’s promise to us and may we walk as a guiding light to others of the way Christ has laid before us. I truly believe Jimmy Lloyd Sapp stayed the course and I pray that we will too.
