RED LETTER CHALLENGE

50 Days until EASTER

Brother Aaron extends a challenge for you to read three verses per day beginning with Matthew, Mark, Luke, John and Revelations starting today until Easter. Bible Study & Church Service will follow the study of these books of the Bible. A church family who studies together stays together.

Pastor Aaron Beaty began our morning service with this scripture reading.

John 1:1-5 (KJV) In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²The same was in the beginning with God. ³All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴In him was life; and the life was the light of men. ⁵And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.

One of my favorite scriptures is Genesis 1:1 In the beginning GOD. John, years past the Old Testament of the Holy Bible and we have arrived into the New Testament after the birth of Jesus and into the teaching and John says, “In the beginning was the Word”, and the Word was with God..
